What are Supportive Services?

Supportive Services are provided by your Service Coordinator to help you access services that are in your reach.



A Service Coordinator may help with the following...

Annual Assessments



Meet with you yearly to assess your needs.

Community Activities



Educate you on available services/ programs in your area.

- Set up programs and activities to be held at your site with the assistance of residents.
- Hold monthly or bimonthly tenant meetings.
- Create a monthly newsletter/calendar.

Education Assistance



Assist you in gaining services to complete your GED

- Help you to obtain information on college information, entrance exams, scholarships, and applications
- Obtain information to help you further your education

Family Assistance



Help you to find assistance for your children

- Programming for your children such as play-groups, homework clubs, holiday activities
- Provide resources for parental support
- Provide resources for available childcare that may be in the area
- Birth to 3 years old services
- Early Intervention
- Head Start
- Finding tutoring services

Financial Assistance



Assist you in understanding and reading your bills.

- Budget assistance
- Help you to set goals to meet your financial needs
- Unemployment assistance
- Contact companies such as heating and phone companies that may be able to get you discounts on your bills.
- Help you to understand your correspondence and mail.
- Help you to complete your Department of Human Services paperwork.
- Assist you in enrolling in government benefits, such as Food Stamps, the Food Bank, Low Income Subsidy, LIHEAP, WIC, Unemployment, Supplemental Income, and Cash Assistance.
- Sign you up for a free phone if you qualify.

Health & Mental Health Care



Help you to find discounted dental, hearing, and vision services.

- Guide you to services regarding mental health and drug and alcohol abuse.
- Assist you in obtaining transportation to your medical and dental appointments.
- Call the doctor's office if you are unable to make your own appointments.
- Act as a liaison with local care providers to ensure successful discharge and transition from a hospital or nursing home.
- Assist in planning relocation to a nursing home or long term care facility if necessary.

- Schedule on site immunizations if possible
- Help you to find affordable prescriptions.

Homemaker Assistance



Assist you in obtaining help with cooking, cleaning, shopping, and laundry services.

- Assist in completing food bank applications and getting you the information on local pantries and distribution sites.
- Arrange for Meals on Wheels.
- Inquire into getting you help with a lifeline program.

Housing



Obtain information in assisting you to obtain permanent housing

- Assist in your applying for a mortgage and working with you in budgeting to do so

Medicaid, Social Security & Insurance



Help you to understand your explanation of benefits statements from Medicaid and from your insurance companies.

- Assist you in obtaining help to get the right medical insurance.
- Help you to understand changes and updates with Social Security, Medicaid, and private insurance plans.
